#### Thanks for your Help

Nearly 250 COA Members Responded







Thanks to everyone who responded to COA's Legislative Alert on AB 407 – a COA sponsored bill – that would create an alternate way for surgeons to become certified to perform fluoroscopy and gain the ability to supervise radiology technologists without having to take and pass the state-mandated Fluoroscopy Certification test. COA has received many complaints that the state-mandated fluoroscopy test does not address radiation safety in clinical practice and the testing process is too cumbersome, delaying surgeons' ability to get into practice in California.

To comply with a new Joint Commission accreditation standard, many hospitals/ASCs will be requiring their surgeons to take radiation safety training. COA believes that this training should count towards their ability to be certified to perform fluoroscopy. AB 407 would make this clear. The California Radiologic Society, the statewide society representing radiologists, and the California Society of Radiologic Technologists are opposed to the bill. We are continuing to dialogue with the opposition to see if there is a way to remove their opposition.

We are pleased to report that AB 407 passed the Assembly Business & Professions Committee. The bill will next be heard in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.


